LITURGICAL MINISTRIES

PROCLAIMER OF THE WORD (READER)

There is one lector at each Mass. The Lector gives glory and praise to God through the
proclamation of Sacred Scripture, prayers of the faithful, and announcements at Mass with a
humble heart.

EXTRAORDINARY MINISTERS of Holy Communion (CHALICE & HOST SERVER)

• This ministry is for those who feel a strong devotion and calling to serve Jesus Christ to others during the Eucharist and the way they live their lives.

ALTAR SERVERS

 Altar servers are participants on the altar which includes service to the priest and/or deacon during weekly Masses, weddings, funerals, and other liturgical ceremonies as needed.

USHERS

- Men, women, and older teens of the parish are invited to join this ministry.
- Ushers provide guidance and direction for visitors.
- Greet parishioners as they enter the worship space, direct people to seats, and assist those in need.
- Direct communion lines and assist during Mass as needed.
- The usher would confirm the gift bearers are present. If not, then the usher would request a parishioner to present the gifts to the altar.

HEAD USHER

- Open and secure church operations. Training and checklist will be provided.
- Provide guidance and direction for any situations of a medical nature that may come up, and for the safety of the environment during the Liturgy.
- Collect the weekly offerings after Mass, secure monies, and place the bag in the safe.

GIFT BEARERS

• 2-3 Volunteers to present the host and wine to the priest for blessing.

GREETERS

• Those called to this ministry should have a heart for the people of God, a desire to share the joy of welcoming every individual who walks through the door.

MASS SETUP

- Mass Set Up is the source of our Catholic faith.
- You will be guided to prepare the serving tray with the items which come into contact with the Holy Body and the Holy Blood of the Lord, liturgical items and cloths, and Roman Missal.
- A rotating schedule will be provided.

MUSIC MINISTRY

- St. Francis Xavier's Music Ministry serves to bring together those with a love and a
 talent for music to lead and support the congregation in unanimous sung prayer,
 enhance the sacredness and beauty of parish liturgies, and to evangelize through the
 sharing of music and song. By offering our time and our talents, we minister to all
 who listen as well as each other.
- Singers and musicians of all ages are welcomed! Looking for musicians who are willing to share the gifts that God has blessed them with. No experience necessary!
- The group rehearses throughout the year for holy days, holidays, funerals, weddings, and liturgical ceremonies.

All ministers participating in Mass should arrive at least 20 minutes before the service. Masses include Holy Days, Holidays, Funerals, Weddings, and liturgical ceremonies as needed. *A liturgical schedule will be provided for weekly Masses throughout the year.*

Training and instruction will be offered every other month for each ministry prior to participating. An in-service is provided periodically.

Anyone interested in the ministries should be confirmed in the Catholic Church and in good standing; the Pastor may approve exceptions.

PRAYER SERVICES

INTERCESSORY | OPEN DOOR PRAYER GATHERING

- Everyone is invited to pray with us. Intercessory prayer is the act of praying on behalf of others.
 Christian prayer becomes intercession since it is offered to God through and by Christ. Jesus closed the gap between us and God when he died on the cross for us. Because of Jesus' mediation, we can now intercede in prayer on behalf of others, for the lost, and for those asking God to grant their requests according to His Will.

MORNING PRAYER

- Is offered for anyone who would like to start their day with communal prayer. The prayer service lasts approximately 30 minutes. Members of the gathered assembly lead the service.

PRAYER CHAIN

- St. Francis Xavier's Prayer Chain provides spiritual support and healing for parishioners, and their families and friends. Prayers may be concerns for the sick, hospitalized, chronically ill, or for a loved one during a troubled time.
- Your prayer request will be included in the daily prayers of our members.
- When placing someone on the prayer chain, please obtain their permission when giving full names and circumstances. All prayers are confidential to our prayer warriors.

ROSARY

Pope Francis invites everyone to rediscover the beauty of the rosary, "I invite you to pray the rosary, and to carry it in your hands or in your pockets. The recitation of the rosary is the most beautiful prayer we can offer to the Virgin Mary; it is a contemplation on the stages of the life of Jesus the Savior with his Mother Mary and is a weapon that protects us from evils and temptations."

- Please consider joining the rosary group in prayer before Saturday and Sunday Mass. All are welcome! We practice the rosary as our devotion to prayer and meditation on the life of Jesus, as well as a prayer to Mary to offer our prayers to God.

- We must be willing to humble ourselves before God, surrender every part of our lives to His

 in truth" (John 4:23).

COUNCILS AND MINISTRIES

PARISH COUNCIL

- The role of the Parish Pastoral Council is to help set a vision for the parish and to be consultative to the pastor. They assist and update the pastor with parish happenings, listen to parishioner's concerns, and to act as the voice for the parishioners.
- The council also serves to give feedback on new ideas or proposals, and to give parish members a chance to provide input on parish needs and concerns. The mission is to stay informed and to communicate our parish goals to the faith community and to recognize St. Francis Xavier Parish as a vibrant and holy parish.
- Members must be confirmed catholic and an active member in the parish. The suggested term of service is 3 years, the parish council meets every other month from September to May.

FINANCE COUNCIL

- The Mission of the Finance Council is to advise the pastor in the execution of the church budget. Its role is to monitor expenses and income to assure that resources are properly allocated and accounted for.
- Members must be confirmed catholic and an active member in the parish. The suggested term of service is 3 years, the finance committee meets quarterly or as needed throughout the year.

SERVICE & HOSPITALITY

Grow in your faith life. With your support, our parish continues to strengthen our relationship with God. There are numerous possibilities to grow in different areas of your faith. This is an invitation to become a steward of our Catholic faith community to serve others by enriching their lives. Please consider one of the following opportunities to give back and engage in our faith.

SACRISTAN

- Sacristans take care of the Church by cleaning the sacristy, altar, church, St. Francis Hall, and parish office.
- Teams of two are scheduled weekly and rotated. They may choose a day and time that fits their schedule.

LAUNDER ALTAR LINENS AND ALTAR SERVER ALBS

- We need volunteers to take turns laundering altar linens, purificators, corporal, and towels on a weekly basis.
- Occasionally altar server albs become soiled and are in need of a good washing and ironing.

EUCHARISTIC MINISTERS FOR HOMEBOUND

The faith-filled members of St. Francis Xavier Parish Homebound Ministry are committed
to minister to those parishioners who are temporarily or permanently confined to their homes
due to age, illness or disability; offering the Eucharist, comfort and a sense of belonging to the
St. Francis Xavier faith community.

SOCIAL MINISTRY COMMITTEE

- Serves to empower the entire parish community to fulfill the gospel mandate of justice
 and charity. The social ministry commission coordinates and initiates organized efforts to
 facilitate this social mission into every aspect of parish life. The breadth of this mission is guided
 by the social teachings of the church.

- This ministry is a listening ministry providing pastoral care for people in all kinds of difficult and transitional situations. They are trained lay volunteers who extend the care of the faith community.

LITURGY / WORSHIP COMMITTEE

- Liturgy is the coming together of our community in prayer and worship of God. Our community,
 the body of Christ, is made up of many members, each gifted in a special way. It is the desire of
 the Liturgy Committee to coordinate our coming together so that each member of the
 community may bring their gift to the Altar and feel very much a part of the liturgical Celebration.
- The Worship Commission meets and coordinates the Liturgical seasons in accord with the guidelines of the church doctrine.
- The Decor committee is part of our Worship Commission. The Decor committee makes changes to the church according to the Liturgical season with the Pastor's guidance.
- Decor welcomes parishioners to share creative ideas, decorate and beautify, and water indoor plants.

BUILDING, MAINTENANCE & GROUNDS

- We believe everyone has unique skills and abilities, however great or small, which can be used
 to keep the properties of the parish in good repair to provide a safe and inviting environment for
 all parish activities.
- Managing a parish facility is very similar to managing any other type of building or campus. The
 only difference being a parish needs to rely on volunteer labor to identify needs, schedule
 maintenance, and get the job done.
- Volunteers are appreciated for ongoing projects such as mowing, grooming, and maintaining the grounds, landscaping, watering, planting flowers, fall and spring cleanup, shovel snow, light painting, floor maintenance, operational needs, and special projects.

ST. JOSEPH's MEN GUILD (Men's Club)

- As a member of the parish, and at least 18 years old, you are a member of the St. Joseph's Men Guild (Men's Club).
- All men are invited to join. We participate in helping the needs of the parish and community.
 This Guild is linked to Genesee County parishes. Each year on May 1st, the feast of St. Joseph, the parishes gather for Mass and luncheon.

ST. FRANCIS XAVIER WOMEN'S GUILD

- As a member of the parish, and at least 18 years old, you are a member of the Women's Guild.
- All women are invited to attend. Meetings are held at 9 am on the third Saturday of the month from September through May.
- Monthly meetings are organized with one or two of the following: speakers, crafts, potluck, special events, and crafts.
- The Women's Guild is responsible for care to the needs of the Altar and works closely with the Worship committee.

- The women participate in various events, such as bazaars, raffles, rummage sales, bake sales and various fundraising events. In addition, they initiate social events for the parish, for example Lenten Soup Suppers.

GENERAL OFFICE MINISTRY

- Please contact the parish office to assist with small clerical jobs as needed during the workday.
 Various tasks may involve the preparation of mailings including folding and stuffing the letter, stamping, sealing envelopes, and transporting mail to the local post office; stuff and fold bulletins, assist with event callings, and assist with projects as needed.
- Assist with the website per the direction of the parish support person locating catholic articles or YouTube stories that may be of interest. Update parish Facebook with current parish events, services, or seasonal inspirations.

FUNERAL LUNCHEON MINISTRY

- A member of the Women's Guild communicates with the family to organize a luncheon for those attending the funeral. The Women's and Men's Guild work together to prepare the facility for the grieving family and friends.
- This ministry is in need of volunteers who are willing to serve at these luncheons. Assistance is
 appreciated for setting up and tearing down chairs and tables, preparing and serving drinks,
 displaying food on the buffet table by the time the guests arrive. In addition, a crew is needed for
 cleanup and a designated person to pick up the catering and transport the food to the church.
- Parishioners who volunteer to help at funeral luncheons see firsthand how grateful the families
 are and that the people who attend can feel the love and compassion extended to them by our
 parishioners.

OUTREACH EAST FOOD PANTRY

- St Francis Xavier Outreach Food Pantry began in 1994 serving Otisville, Millington, Columbiaville, and Otter Lake. It is a non-denominational program.
- It is available on the last Thursday of each month from 11 am to 2 pm in Quaderer Hall with 25-30 families receiving our services.
- Clients may call St. Francis when emergency services are needed. The parish office will contact the chairperson to provide assistance.
